EFFECTIVE WITH May 22 series: 35) When counting batters faced for a reliever to determine when he changes to "B" grades, an intentional walk shall not count as a batter faced.

CLARIFICATION OF RULE #18 and BOARD GAMES MISSED RULES:

If an injury comes up more than once for a player in one game, his injury is the total of all the games missed that is rolled for him.

ALL MANAGERS:

When reporting the results of a series ter print. send me linescores, pitchers, HRS, stars of the game, INJURIES THAT OCCUR IN THAT GAME, comments about EACH game SEPARATELY when I receive at least one statistics and a few comments about the series. This sheet on every team. is sent to me even if you also are sending play-by-play scoresheets because it is an open team series or a series with my team. When preparing the newsletter, I must rely solely on your game comments to report series results. I don't have the time to go over play-by-plays.

ALL HOME MANAGERS:

When sending out play-by-plays, for each game have a minimum boxscore along side the play-by-play listing at least AB, H, R, RBI, 2B, 3B, HR, BB, SO. Some of the scoresheets I have received that don't have this are hard to follow. All PO, A & E should be recorded on the play-byplay scoresheet. PO&A records need not be kept, but the scoresheet should read like an official major league scoresheet listing clearly everything that occurred in each game.
